

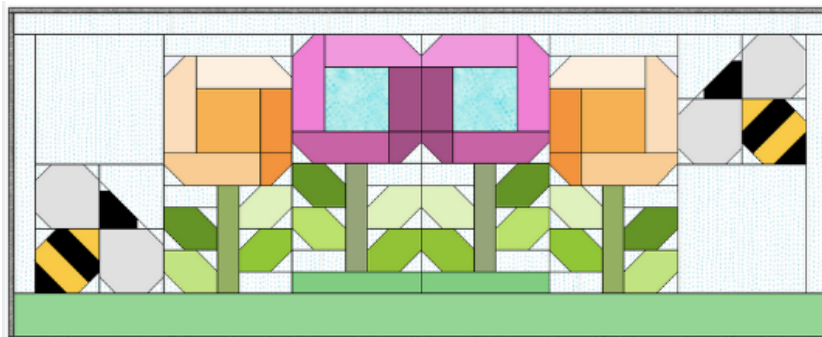

TABLE RUNNER LAYOUT

Instructions-

- Follow the steps to below to assemble the table runner.
- Read all instructions carefully before cutting.
- Use 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise stated.
- Press seam allowance as shown by arrows.
- I recommend starching fabric before cutting. It will make cutting and sewing easier, especially when working with smaller pieces.
- WOF means width of fabric (based on 42" wide fabric).

QUILT BLOCKS			
Fabric	Yardage	Quantity /Size	
 Green	3" x WOF	A	(1) 2" x 38 1/2" rectangle
 Background	1/4 yard	B	(1) 1 1/2" x 38 1/2" rectangle
		C	(2) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangles
		D	(2) 6 1/2" squares
Batting			19" x 39"
Backing	1/2 yard		
Binding	1/4 yard		(3) 2 1/4" x WOF

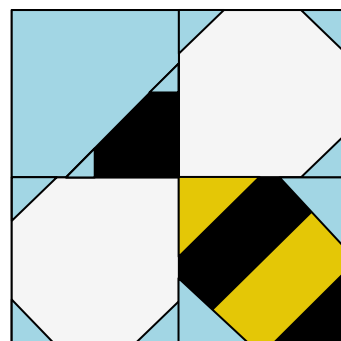
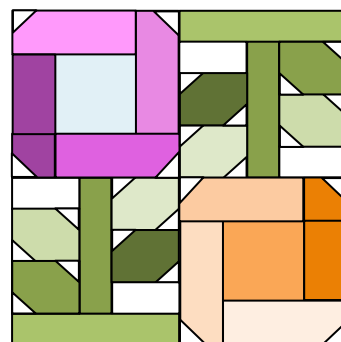
*Yardage does not include needed materials for individual blocks.

**Yardage is rounded up to allow room for trimming.

Make two Zinnia Flowers 12" quilt blocks and two Bumble Bee 6" quilt blocks.

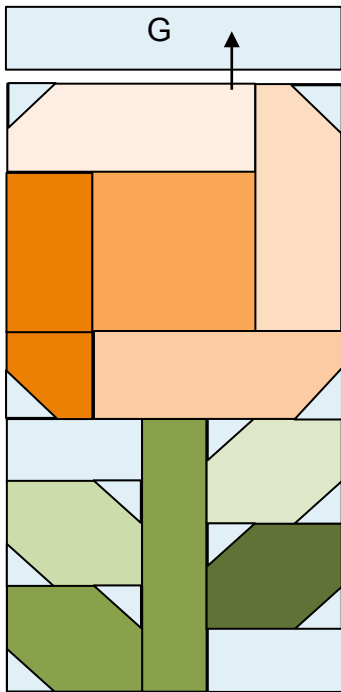

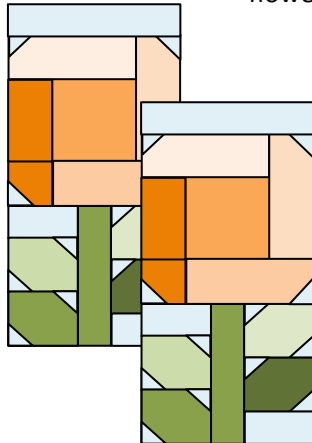
Zinnia Block Adjustment

To offset the flower block design, you will need to make a slight adjustment in one rectangle unit per block.



* Cut two (G) rectangles from background fabric 1 1/2" x 6 1/2".

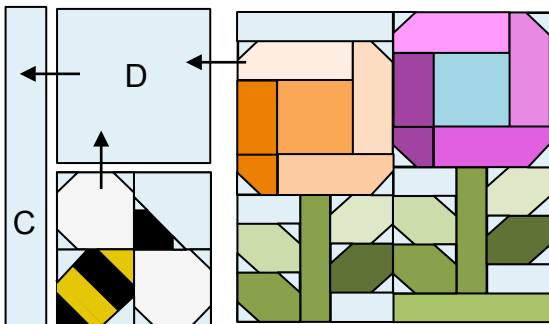
When assembling your units, shift placement of G rectangle to the top of flower.



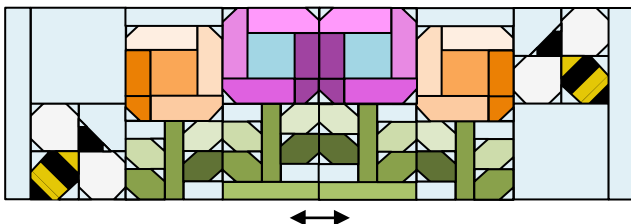
*Complete 2 units.

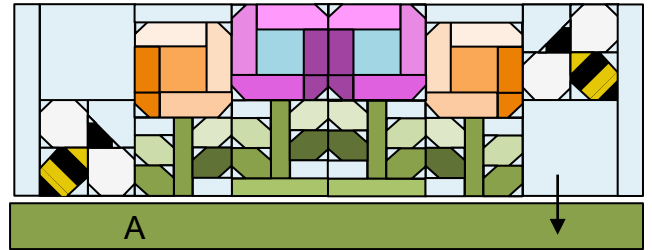
Step 1



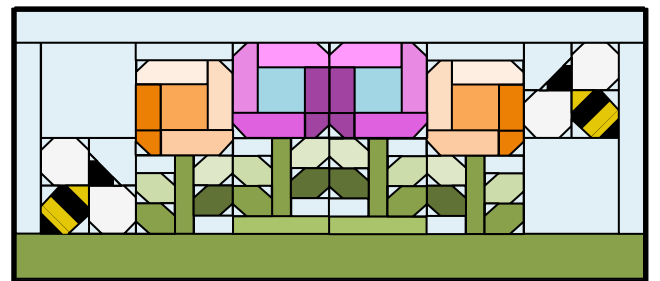
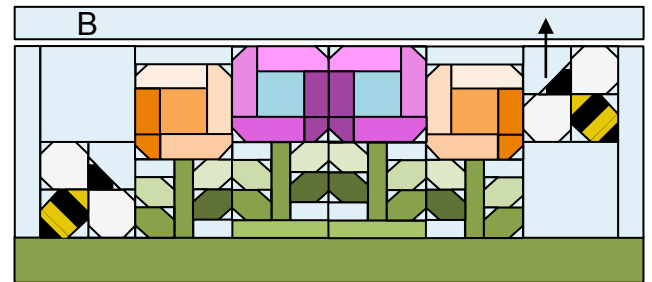
*Alternate placement of flowers as diagram and create 2 units.

The finished table runner measures 15" x 38".

FINISHING DETAILS:

Layer your backing fabric, batting and topper to create a quilt sandwich, quilt as desired. Piece the binding strips end to end and bind table runner using your favorite binding method.
